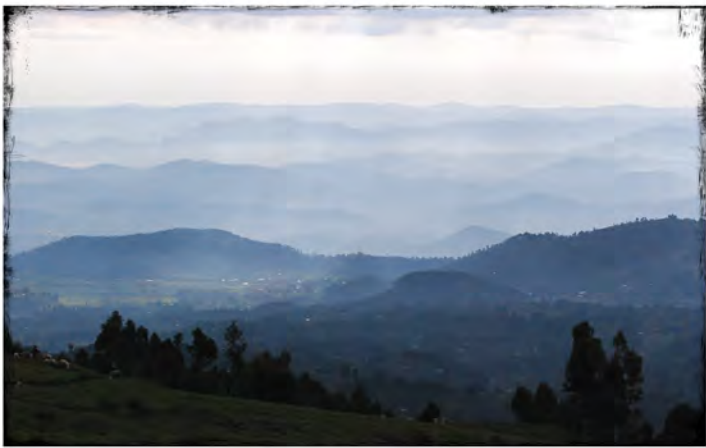

A GROWING POPULATION

The mountain gorilla population continues to be the only great ape species increasing in number in the entire world, thanks in part to the Gorilla Doctors' life-saving veterinary care in Rwanda, Uganda, and the Democratic Republic of Congo. Results from the recent mountain gorilla census in Bwindi Impenetrable National Park revealed that the population has grown from 782 to 880 individuals. There were many new infants born in the National Parks in 2013. After each birth in a habituated group, a Gorilla Doctor has assessed the health of both the mother and infant, ensuring the new baby's successful growth and development.

GORILLA HEALTH CARE IN RWANDA

Drs. Dawn, Jean Felix and Noel treated a wide variety of gorilla health issues in Rwanda's Volcanoes National Park in 2013. Interventions were conducted to free 5-year-old Gutungura of Agashya group and 2.5-year-old Susuruka of Bwenge group from wire and rope snares. A respiratory illness outbreak in Sabyinyo group was curbed as a result of Gorilla Doctors thorough monitoring and interventions to administer medications. Three year-old infant Sacco, of Agashya group, was treated for her inflamed feet that prevented her from keeping up with her group as they traveled. Additionally, hundreds of routine health checks of habituated groups in Rwanda were conducted by our hard-working veterinarians.

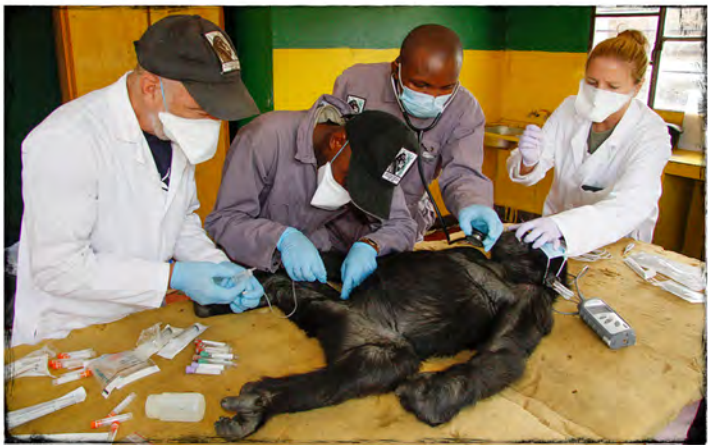

WILDLIFE DISEASE SURVEILLANCE

Gorilla Doctors is implementing the USAID Emerging Pandemic Threats PREDICT project in Rwanda and Uganda. The objective of PREDICT is to detect viruses in wildlife that could pose a health threat to humans. Drs. Benard and Rachael (in Uganda) and Drs. Julius and Olivier (in Rwanda) have humanely and safely collected samples from hundreds of live bats, rodents and primates. To date, PREDICT has discovered more than 250 new viruses in wildlife worldwide.

CARING FOR ORPHAN GORILLAS

In 2013, Gorilla Doctors continued to provide excellent medical care to the only three mountain gorillas living in captivity in the world, Maisha, Ndakasi, and Ndeze, at the Senkwekwe Center in Rwanda. Gorilla Doctors also collaborated with partners to rescue another mountain gorilla, Matabishi, who was found alone in a cornfield outside of Virunga National Park, DRC in July 2013. Grauer's gorilla orphans Baraka and Isangi made the move to the GRACE center where they joined other orphaned Grauer's gorillas, and preparations were made to move Ihirwe, the 4-year-old Grauer's gorilla orphan at the Kinigi facility in Rwanda, to the GRACE center in early 2014.

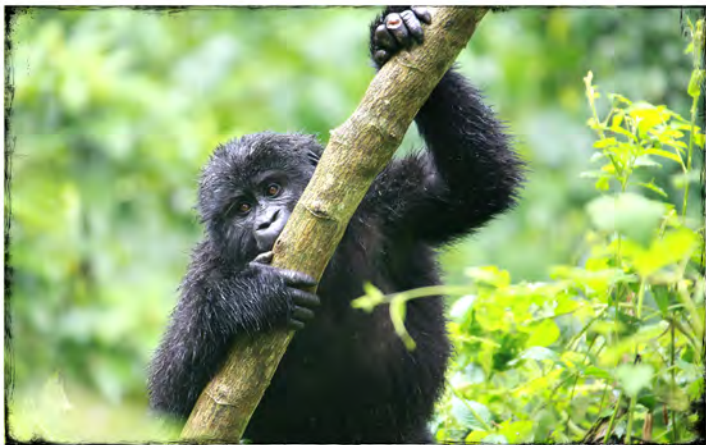

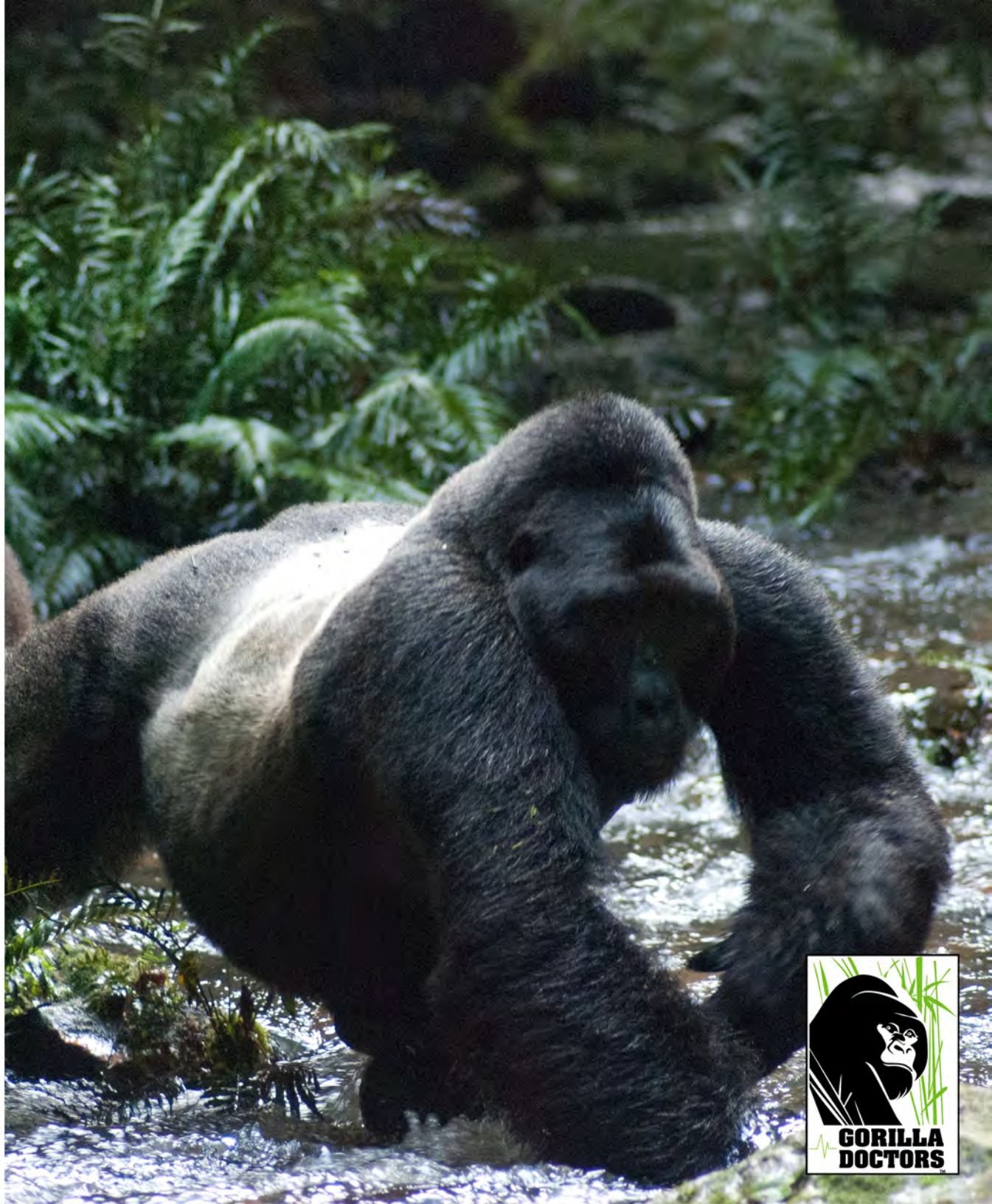
ONE HEALTH

Gorilla Doctors recognize that the health of the gorillas is inextricably linked to that of the entire ecosystem. In addition to providing life-saving care, our veterinary team further protects gorillas by supporting health programs for people and their animals living and working in and around gorilla habitat. Countless domestic animals and livestock were treated by the Gorilla Doctors in 2013 and hundreds of National Park workers, along with their family members, were given access to medical care thanks to the Gorilla Doctors Employee Health Program, led by program manager Jean Paul Lukusa.

GORILLA HEALTH CARE IN UGANDA

Gorilla Doctors vets, led by Uganda Field Vet Dr. Fred, freed multiple gorillas from snares in Bwindi and Mgahinga Gorilla National Parks, Uganda in 2013. Juvenile Kajeyo of Habinyanja group was released from a wire snare in January, while mother mountain gorilla Inshuti of Nyakagezi group was freed from a wire snare in September. Another Nyakagezi group gorilla, silverback Rukundo, also became ensnared but managed to free himself before the intervention. Dr. Fred also treated many mountain gorillas for various conditions ranging from life-threatening injuries sustained from fighting to severe respiratory illness outbreaks.

CONDUCTING RESEARCH

Every year, Gorilla Doctors collects thousands of samples from gorillas and other animals needing medical attention in the region where we work. These samples, along with samples collected during animal post mortem exams, are shipped to our veterinary pathologist at UC Davis, Dr. Linda Lowenstine, for further examination and research. Most notably, blood samples were collected from a unique, isolated population of Grauer's gorillas in Mt. Tshiabirimu outside of Virunga National Park, DRC in 2013. Gorilla Doctors, along with our partners at ICCN, are working to evaluate the overall health of the population, determine why this tiny population is dwindling, and map the whole genome of the species.

CAPACITY BUILDING


Gorilla Doctors currently employs 14 African veterinarians and is perpetually working to mentor the next generation of wildlife health experts. In 2013, we continued to sponsor educational training programs in close cooperation with African schools and universities and continuing education for our staff members. By investing in this training, we are working towards in-country veterinarians becoming the primary and sole providers of gorilla veterinary care in the region. Gorilla Doctors also invests time and resources in furthering the education of the National Park rangers by conducting workshops and providing hands-on training in the field.

FREEING GORILLAS FROM SNARES

Interventions to free gorillas from poachers' snares are a cornerstone of the Gorilla Doctors work. Sadly, poaching is still a very real threat in the region where we work. While the poachers are intending to capture small animals, such as duiker and bush pigs, unsuspecting gorillas become ensnared and can die of sepsis. Due in part to the Gorilla Doctors vigilance and health care, many ensnared gorillas were successfully freed and treated in Uganda, Rwanda, and the Democratic Republic of Congo in 2013.

GORILLA HEALTH CARE IN DRC



Between snare interventions in Kahuzi-Biega National Park, orphan health care at the Senkwekwe Center and health assessments of gorilla groups in the M23 rebel-occupied Mikenko sector of Virunga National Park, DRC Field Vets Drs. Eddy and Martin stayed very busy in 2013. Infant Grauer's gorillas Iragi and Uhuru were freed from wire snares in Kahuzi-Biega NP and warring silverbacks Mukunda and Bageni were severely injured in Virunga NP, requiring the veterinary attention of Drs. Eddy and Martin. Health assessments and sample collection interventions were conducted in Mt. Tshiabirimu, the mountain gorilla orphan trio received their annual exams and Gorilla Doctors helped to rescue another mountain gorilla orphan, named Matabishi, in June.

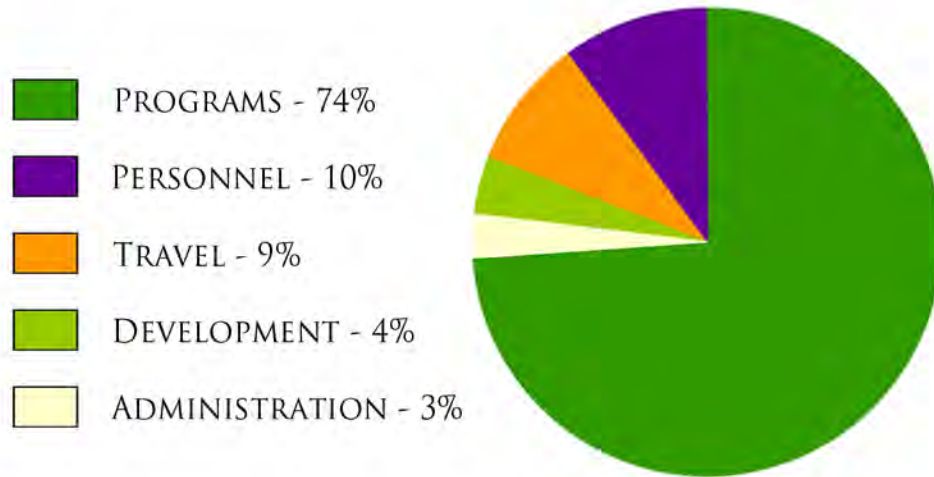

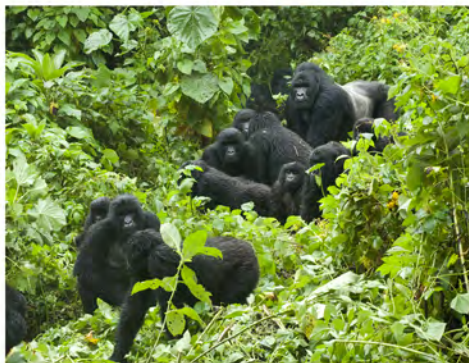
