

Caring for Wild Eastern Gorillas

The cornerstone of Gorilla Doctors work is routine health monitoring: our field veterinarians trek hundreds of miles in the forest every year to visually check the health of every single habituated mountain and Grauer's gorilla group in Rwanda, Uganda, and the DR Congo. During routine health checks, Gorilla Doctors look for any sign of illness or injury in the group, making detailed notes to be recorded in the IMPACT database. This allows long-term monitoring of a case and tracking of disease outbreaks, building a detailed database of the eastern gorillas' health over many years. This year, Gorilla Doctors made 389 visits to habituated eastern gorilla groups to assess their health.




















Life-Saving Interventions

In 2015, Gorilla Doctors field veterinarians intervened to treat multiple injured or ailing mountain and Grauer's gorillas in Rwanda, Uganda, and the DR Congo. From silverbacks with severe traumatic injuries, to respiratory disease outbreaks affecting entire groups, to gorillas caught in poacher's snares, we are proud to say that 18 eastern gorillas received life-saving veterinary care this year.


















Caring for Orphan Gorillas

Our veterinarians continue to provide healthcare for the only mountain gorillas living in captivity in the world: the Senkwekwe Center's Maisha, Ndakasi, Ndeze and Matabishi. Dr. Eddy Kambale also cared for orphan Grauer's gorilla Kalonge after she fractured her femur in a fall from a tree inside her enclosure. Fortunately, she healed completely and was successfully moved to her new home at the GRACE sanctuary, where she has settled in with her new family of fellow rescued Grauer's gorillas.

Advancing Our Knowledge

Every year, our field veterinarians acquire new skills, knowledge, and equipment to better serve the health of the eastern gorilla population. This year, American veterinary surgeon Dr. Donna Shettko traveled to Rwanda to give a hands-on training workshop on wound healing and surgical techniques at our Regional Headquarters. Our field team also acquired a portable digital X ray machine from Bingo Environmental Foundation, thanks to Hannover-based nonprofit Benfiz e.V. and many other generous donors, allowing our vets to conduct more comprehensive diagnostics on complicated cases. Our teams also gathered often for scheduled rounds, where our veterinarians collectively discussed recent cases and lessons learned.

One Health

In order to ensure the long-term health of eastern gorillas in Africa, Gorilla Doctors implements several human and domestic animal health projects in the region. This year, over 2,200 national park workers and their family members received preventive health care through our Employee Health Program. Our field veterinarians vaccinated dozens of dogs in areas around the national parks and continue to collect samples and learn more about pathogens in wildlife species within gorilla habitat through the PREDICT (See August) project.

PREDICT Surveillance

This year, our veterinarians began work on the second 5-year phase of the USAID Emerging Pandemic Threats PREDICT project. Our veterinary teams will continue to conduct surveillance in Uganda, Rwanda, and eastern Democratic Republic of Congo to detect viruses in wildlife that pose a risk for spillover into human populations. PREDICT is led by the UC Davis One Health Institute, with Drs. Julius Nziza, Benard Ssebide, and Dr. Eddy Kambale serving as Country Coordinators on the ground.




















Spotlight in the Media

Wildlife Health

While eastern gorillas are the primary patients of the Gorilla Doctors, our field vets also treat other wildlife in need. In 2015, Gorilla Doctors cared for two infant chimpanzees orphaned by poachers, worked with Virunga National Park staff to fit 15 forest elephants with electronic tracking collars to better monitor the herds' movements and protect them from poachers, and intervened to help treat sick and injured endangered golden monkeys and return them to their forest homes.


