Our hospital is the forest

When a gorilla is sick or injured we make "forest calls" -taking care of gorillas in their home environment. Gorilla Doctors releases animals from snares, performs physical exams and surgeries, and administers life-saving medication – always while surrounded by our gorilla patients' families.

Gorilla Doctors is dedicated to conserving wild mountain and eastern lowland (Grauer's) gorillas through life-saving veterinary medicine, science and a One Health approach. One Health recognizes that the health of people, animals and the environment are inextricably linked – to conserve gorillas we must also advance the health of people and the environments upon which we all depend.

Gorilla Doctors is the only organization in the world providing these endangered animals with hands-on care, which is credited with half of the annual population growth rate in habituated mountain gorillas.

Gorilla Doctors is an international team of veterinarians monitoring the health of gorillas in Rwanda, Uganda and DR Congo.

We work in parks spanning the Virunga Volcanoes Massif:


- Volcanoes National Park, Rwanda

We also work in:

- Bwindi Impenetrable National Park, Uganda
- Kahuzi-Biega National Park, DR Congo

Gorilla Doctors also manages veterinary care for great apes confiscated from poachers at the Senkwekwe Center and the Lwiro Primate Rehabilitation Center, both in DR Congo.

A conservation success...but threats continue

Mountain gorillas were reclassified in late 2018 from 'critically endangered' to 'endangered' – a wildlife conservation 'win' thanks to the hard work of Gorilla Doctors and its government partners and other gorilla NGOs. But mountain gorillas still face significant threats to their long-term survival, as do the critically endangered Grauer's gorillas, including:

- Dense and growing human populations surrounding the parks
- Potential disease transmission resulting from close human-wildlife interactions
- Poaching for bush meat and illegal resource extraction inside parks
- World's second largest Ebolavirus outbreak in DR Congo placing gorillas at risk
- Rebel activity in DR Congo impacting ability to monitor and protect gorillas

Mountain gorilla healthcare in Rwanda



In 2018/19, Drs. Julius Nziza, Jean Bosco (Noel) Noheri, Gaspard Nzayisenga and Adrien Ntwari monitored the health of mountain gorillas in Volcanoes National Park. One case highlighting the time and energy we dedicate to gorilla health was the respiratory infection outbreak in Mafunzo group in April 2019.

When gorillas get sick it requires daily "forest calls" to monitor their health. In the case of Mafunzo group, several members were observed with symptoms of a respiratory infection. Silverback Mafunzo was also fighting with lone silverback Mutobo, and while the rest of the group recovered, his condition deteriorated. Mafunzo also lost five females to Mutobo and sustained several wounds. Drs. Noel and Gaspard treated Mafunzo with antibiotics and continued to monitor his condition while he recovered.

A busy year caring for Uganda's mountain gorillas



Drs. Benard Ssebide, Fred Nizeyimana and Ricky Okwir Okello had an extremely busy year monitoring the health of nearly half of the world's remaining mountain gorillas.

One significant case involved treating the oldest habituated female gorilla in Bwindi, Kashundwe of Katwe group, for a severe eye infection. Following consultation with a veterinary ophthamology expert, Kashundwe received a lengthy course of antibiotics. During treatment we discovered she'd lost vision in the affected eye but because of our intervention, the infection didn't spread to cause systemic illness and she is alive and well today.

Significant challenges hinder gorilla health monitoring in DR Congo



This year was a challenging one for Gorilla Doctors' Eddy Kambale Syaluha and Martin Kabuyaya in DR Congo. Our team and their families were at tremendous risk from the second largest Ebolavirus outbreak in history, which continues. As well, our veterinarians' work in the field was curtailed by the danger posed by rebel militia illegally occupying the forest.

Nevertheless, they continued to monitor the health of mountain and Grauer's gorillas in Virunga and Kahuzi-Biega National Parks. They also performed three interventions on unusual patients; at the request of Congolese wildlife authorities, Drs. Eddy and Martin treated forest elephants suffering from snares and bullet wounds.

Grauer's gorillas remain critically endangered

Being the largest primate on the planet, critically endangered Grauer's gorillas have experienced a 77% population decline over the last 20 years. This year Drs. Eddy and Martin monitored the health of three groups of habituated Grauer's gorillas in Kahuzi-Biega National Park, DR Congo.

Given that the majority of Grauer's gorillas are unhabituated, we need new tools to monitor their health because we typically cannot get close enough to wild Grauer's gorillas to perform visual assessments. With support from National Geographic and a generous donor, Dr. Eddy continued his work to develop non-invasive protocols for monitoring the health of non-habituated Grauer's gorillas. The longterm goal is to field test and implement these techniques in order to better monitor the health of all critically endangered Grauer's gorillas.

Caring for the health of orphaned gorillas

Despite Gorilla Doctors provides veterinary care for the four orphaned mountain gorillas at Senkwekwe in Virunga National Park, DR Congo. Fortunately, Matabishi, Muzuka (aka Yalala), Ndeze and Ndakasi were in general good health this year. Matabishi sustained bite wounds from wild chimpanzees, but following treatment from Dr. Eddy made a full recovery. Muzuka was treated for worms and skin lesions but also recovered following treatment and changes to her diet to increase her nutrition.

A photo taken by caregivers at Senkwewke (one of them wearing a Gorilla Doctors

t-shirt) and posted on Facebook went viral, resulting in media coverage and tens of thousands of impressions on social media. The most frequently asked question – is this photo real? The answer: Yes, gorillas can actually stand up, and the Senkwekwe orphans likely do so as a result of spending their lives with their upright human caregivers.

Lwiro: Primate rescue & rehabilitation in DR Congo

As an important implementing partner for the Graueri Conservation Action Plan, Gorilla Doctors leads veterinary medical capacity-building at the Center for Rehabilitation of Primates at Lwiro in DR Congo.

During this past year, Gorilla Doctors' Dr. Luis Flores led Lwiro staff in conducting and managing:

- 171 surgeries to treat injuries and manage reproduction
- 500 clinical cases and preventative medicine procedures
- 60 new animals admitted to quarantine

In addition, Dr. Flores mentored multiple veterinary interns and university students on research projects.

PREDICT: 2009-2019

For the past 10 years, Gorilla Doctors has implemented the USAID Emerging Pandemic Threats PREDICT project in Rwanda, Uganda and eastern DR Congo for the UC Davis One Health Institute. The goal of PREDICT was to detect wildlife viruses that could pose a risk to human health and identify measures to reduce virus spillover.

Among many of Gorilla Doctors' PREDICT achievements:

- Increased training in One Health for field and lab workers, enabling countries to continue research and surveillance
- Strengthened relationships with government partners
- Increased awareness of human-wildlife interactions and the impact on health for both
- Improved understanding of the importance of wildlife in the ecosystem and how to share the environment safely

Collaboration leads to discovery

Gorilla Doctors is actively engaged in research to better understand health threats to gorillas. This year, Gorilla Doctors continued to collaborate on investigating the role of parasites in causing gastrointestinal disease in mountain gorillas. Initial results show significant differences in parasite loads across geographic sections of the Virungas, as well as differences among age groups.

Further research into the demographic, geographic and ecologic factors contributing to these differences in load will also help increase our understanding of how parasite infections can cause illness in mountain gorillas.

Additionally, with support from the Swiss Embassy in Bukavu, Dr. Luis Flores and Lwiro Rehabilitation Center staff in DR Congo conducted research to improve tuberculosis screening of chimpanzees and other primates at Lwiro, as well as better understand the TB status of local community members.


