Gorilla Doctors is the **only organization in the world** providing life-saving veterinary care to eastern gorillas. Treating 'one gorilla at a time' with a science based One Health approach has helped lead to the extraordinary recovery of mountain gorillas in the wild. But there are still just over 1,000 on the planet, and the Grauer's gorilla remains critically endangered.

Our collective efforts remain as vital as ever.

Gorilla Doctors' Annual Report 2023-2024

At the end of every fiscal year, I think it is important to reflect on the goals we set versus where we landed. I think of this as Gorilla Doctors' magnetic north recalibration. Magnetic north is the direction a compass needle moves as it orients with the Earth's magnetic field. I say this because our day-to-day work never has a fixed point like true north. In conservation, we are always having to adjust and realign our goals with the realities of implementation – an overall increase in operating costs of 20%, the sustained presence of rebel militia in DR Congo preventing our health monitoring of the mountain gorillas in Virunga National Park, the loss of much loved individuals like Ndeze, the longest surviving orphaned mountain gorilla, and the continuous emergence of pathogens impacting the health of both people and eastern gorillas.

That is enough to throw any organization off course, but that is one of the things I love most about leading the Gorilla Doctors team. They are some of the most resourceful, innovative, dedicated, and courageous people I have ever worked with. Gorilla Doctors knows how to be nimble, solve problems, and celebrate our successes, like launching the Gorilla Doctors Michael Cranfield Regional One Health Laboratory, advancing Dr. Noel to serve as our first ever regional pathologist, hiring two new field veterinarians, and growing our community of donors, partners, and friends, to name just a few.

This annual report is in honor of each one of you who makes the work and continued positive impact of Gorilla Doctors possible. Thriving eastern gorillas in the wild is our true north. Until we arrive at that fixed point, we remain intrepid conservationists trekking together toward our magnetic north: saving a species, one gorilla at a time.

IN MEMORIAM ANTOINE MUDAKIKWA, DVM

The conservation world lost a great pioneer of gorilla health with the passing of Dr. Tony Mudakikwa on September 20, 2024. Dr. Mudakikwa worked for more than 25 years championing gorillas and the health of their ecosystem. His long career in Rwanda included being the first Rwandan field veterinarian for Gorilla Doctors beginning in 1995. His tenure with Gorilla Doctors found him advancing to Field Director from 2001- 2002. His leadership inspired and paved the way for many future wildlife veterinarians and young gorilla doctors. Dr. Mudakikwa spent many years as head wildlife veterinarian for the Rwanda Development Board (RDB)– an important position, and one that kept Gorilla Doctors and Dr. Mudakikwa working together closely until his retirement from RDB. He served as a mentor, guide, and friend to many of our current team, and will be greatly missed by us all:




The list of our 2023-2024 Gorilla Guardians[®] is featured in the month of September.

Ubwuzu was coughing and very weak. He received medication and supportive treatment via dart. Today, Ubwuzu is the dominant silverback of Pablo group."

SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH HIGHLIGHT

On January 31, 2024, Gorilla Doctors celebrated the opening of the Gorilla Doctors Michael Cranfield Regional One Health Laboratory at our regional headquarters in Musanze, Rwanda. Serving as a beacon for wildlife health in the region, Gorilla Doctors can now diagnose cause of illness within 24 hours of sample collection, including detection of human-borne pathogens impacting gorilla health.

VETERINARY MEDICINE HIGHLIGHT

January through March of 2024 saw our teams in Rwanda and Uganda monitoring and treating multiple gorilla groups experiencing severe respiratory infection outbreaks. Most individual gorillas recover without treatment, but respiratory illness is still the second leading cause of mortality in mountain gorillas. During this period, 19 mountain gorilla patients across six groups required supportive treatment. All but one made full recoveries. ONE HEALTH HIGHLIGHT

As part of our commitment to One Health, Gorilla Doctors often assists Virunga National Park (PNVi) with veterinary support for wildlife other than gorillas. Last year, PNVi launched a lion collaring program to collect important data on population size and movement, and health. Dr. Eddy led the veterinary aspects of the collaring effort by developing the field protocol, anesthetizing individual lions, collecting samples, and providing medical treatment as needed.

"Mpungwe, a large group of Grauer's gorillas in Kahuzi-Biega National Park, DR Congo keeps challenging us. We are still working to fully habituate and identify individuals, and they often hide in the dense vegetation while we try to conduct our visual health assessments. This curious juvenile munching on epiphytes gave me a little break during one routine health check and I was able to observe a nice full belly and healthy hair coat."




SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH HIGHLIGHT

In April 2024, Gorilla Doctors DR Congo team provided trainings and logistical and technical support for a wildlife census in the highlands sector of Kahuzi-Biega and the southern sector of Maiko National Parks. The primary goal of the census was to assess Grauer's gorilla, chimpanzee, and other wildlife for a baseline against which to monitor population trends. Census teams collected samples for Gorilla Doctors to investigate infectious disease threats, gastrointestinal parasites, and genetic identification.





VETERINARY MEDICINE HIGHLIGHT

After having disappeared into deep, unprotected forest for more than three weeks, Mpungwe group was visited by Dr. Lina upon their return to Kahuzi-Biega National Park. Dr. Lina observed a juvenile with a wire snare cutting through skin and muscle. Drs. Eddy and Fabrice rushed to the forest to join Dr. Lina in rescuing the infant from the snare. Lead silverback Mpungwe kept charging the intervention team. After more than two hours, they successfully anesthetized the juvenile, removed the snare, and treated his severe wounds. The infant ultimately lost the hand, but the stump fully healed and he has adapted well.

"I see gorillas every week, yet I never tire of locking eyes with them and observing their daily activities and routines. Although I cannot think for them, from what I observe, they seem to have learned and accepted how to coexist with humans, despite the many threats we pose to them. I took this picture of Isango Gakuru from the Hirwa group venturing outside the park. He is a twin, and it is rare for great apes to give birth to twins and successfully raise them."

ONE HEALTH HIGHLIGHT

With funding from the Czech Embassy in DR Congo, Dr. Jean-Paul Lukusa, our employee health program manager, conducted an education and awareness workshop for the directors of Kahuzi-Biega National Park. In August, he worked with local physicians to conduct annual health examinations for 106 park personnel. An additional 50 park personnel and their families volunteered to participate in parasite screening and receive de-worming medication. Follow-up samples were collected one month later to analyze the efficacy of treatment.

GORILLA DOCTORS GROWTH

Thanks to a generous gift from the Columbus Zoo and Aquarium, we are in the process of building a new, permanent base of operations in DR Congo. In partnership with Virunga National Park, the new facility will be located in Rumangabo next to park headquarters. This new facility will significantly advance our ability to respond and treat our mountain gorilla patients in the Mikeno sector of Virunga National Park, home to nearly one-third of the total world population of mountain gorillas.

"I was conducting a health assessment of an infant in Posho group and caught this rare glimpse of Magara, the lead silverback. His group is among those only recently habituated, and as you can see, he still did not show me his face. I took his clenched fist, filled with food, as a sign of accomplishment and good health! We continue actively monitoring the health of the infant so I am confident that Magara and I will eventually make eye contact."
